## ORDER 20-01

### ORDER OF THE CITY MANAGER

Pursuant to Section 4-910 through 4-924 of the City of Hallowell Revised Code of Ordinances (1997), the City Manager hereby finds and orders as follows:

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2020 the Governor of the State of Maine declared a Civil State of Emergency related to the spread of novel coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is easily spread from person to person through close contact, and cases of the disease are increasing in the State of Maine;

WHEREAS, the President of the United States and the Center for Disease Control ("CDC"), have urged the public to practice social distancing and not attend events where ten or more people will be gathered; and

WHEREAS, the risk of community spread of COVID-19 seriously impacts the life, health and safety of the public, and public health is imperiled by the person-to-person spread of COVID-19;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me through the statutes of the State of Maine, Sections 4-915, 4-916, and 4-917 of the City of Hallowell Revised Code of Ordinances (1997), and common law authority to protect the public's health, safety and welfare in the event of an emergency, I, Nathaniel Rudy, City Manager of the City of Hallowell, in consultation with the Mayor, do hereby ORDER as follows:

The City of Hallowell has declared a city-wide State of Emergency due to imminent civil emergency, effective March 18, 2020.

No person shall be in or remain in any business establishment within the City, including, but not limited to, restaurants, bars, museums, music venues, retail shops, and any other business establishment where individuals gather in groups or are in close contact with one another, beginning March 18, 2020, and effective daily from 8:00 PM to 2:00 AM. Take-out service is not prohibited by this order.


This order shall remain in effect through March 23, 2020 unless revoked by further order of the City Manager or renewed by action of the City Council.

## CITY COUNCIL

ORDER 20-02:  
ORDER TO EXTEND THE STATE OF EMERGENCY  
DECLARED BY THE CITY MANAGER ON MARCH 18, 2020

BE IT ORDERED by the Hallowell City Council:

That pursuant to Section 4-916 of the City of Hallowell Revised Code of Ordinances (1997) the State of Emergency declared by the City Manager in Order 20-01 effective March 18, 2020 shall be extended, with the added exclusion of overnight accommodations at innkeepers licensed by the City to limits on business establishments, until the City Manager is satisfied that the civil emergency no longer exists and terminates the emergency proclamation by another proclamation.
