1. There were no additions to the agenda.

Note: Nancy Hale, the director for the Aging in Place grant *Comfortably Home*, the program being offered by Maine State Housing Authority through Augusta Housing, will join our November meeting to discuss the program in greater detail. 2. Notes to July 10, 2019 meeting were approved by consensus.

3. Kennebec Paddle Update – About forty participants joined the fleet to paddle from Augusta's Mill Park. Many landed at Hallowell because of a stiff upriver breeze that made paddling arduous. Vision Hallowell and HAAFC shared a display at the start and at the Hallowell boat landing.

4. Old Hallowell Day Report – It was hot! Maggie again guided participation in the event with the quad bike in the parade and the bike-powered blender at the display. Bethel loan the Adaptable Tool display.

5. Partnering with Catholic Charities – SEARCH. Lynn Kidd provided a Memorandum of Understanding for our consideration. Bob sent a copy of our Partner form. Both were sent to the City Manager for review before signing. Note: Lynn has forwarded our Partner form on to the home office.

Maggie enrolled as a SEARCH volunteer to learn about the process. She underwent a background check, an intake interview, and was matched with a person who needed a driver and a person looking for a walking partner. She thought the process worked well for all involved.

9. Age-Friendly Plan – Requirements Review and Domain discussion – Once again our meeting time passed before we were able to explore our responses to the Domains of Livability beyond those discussed earlier.
